





ARTE adds depth to its on-air programmes about art, history, society, literature, cinema, philosophy and the environment with **ARTE ÉDITIONS**.

ARTE ÉDITIONS' editorial policy has built a reputation as one of the key players in the video production market and is well known for the quality of its publications. Complex and historic milestones like the complete cinema of Pierre Etaix (mostly unavailable for 20 years) or a box set featuring Charlie Chaplin's first 35 films, are two examples of why this

reputation is well deserved. There are nearly 100 books available, including top-sellers like *Le Dessous des Cartes (If Maps could Talk)* from Jean-Christophe Victor's programme, Marie-Monique Robin's *The World according to Monsanto*, and the graphic novel *Waltz with Bashir*, inspired by Ari Folman's first animated documentary feature.

ITS PURPOSE IS "TO CONCEIVE AND PRODUCE TELEVISION PROGRAMMES WHICH, IN A BROAD SENSE, ARE CULTURAL AND INTERNATIONAL IN CHARACTER AND CONDUCIVE TO PROMOTING UNDERSTANDING AND COOPERATION BETWEEN EUROPEAN NATIONS".

SUBDIVIDED INTO THREE MAIN COMPANIES: ARTE FRANCE, ARTE DEUTSCHLAND, AND ARTE GEIE, THE GROUP EMPLOYS STAFF FROM FRANCE, GERMANY AND OTHER EUROPEAN COUNTRIES. IN BOTH FRANCE AND GERMANY, 95% OF FUNDING FOR THE CHANNEL COMES FROM THE DIRECT TAX ON HOME TELEVISION SETS. BASED ON AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN FRANCE AND GERMANY, THE CHANNEL IS FINANCED THROUGH THE TELEVISION LICENCE FEE IN BOTH COUNTRIES.

WITH ITS EUROPE-WIDE REACH, ARTE HAS ALSO DEVELOPED A RANGE OF SUCCESSFUL PARTNERSHIPS FOR CO-PRODUCTION AND EXCHANGE OF PROGRAMMES WITH MANY EUROPEAN PUBLIC SERVICE BROADCASTERS.







The ARTE Group is made up of three separate companies:

THE STRASBOURG BASED EUROPEAN ECONOMIC INTEREST GROUPING ARTE GEIE PLUS TWO MEMBER COMPANIES ACTING AS EDITORIAL AND PROGRAMME PRODUCTION CENTRES, ARTE FRANCE IN PARIS AND ARTE DEUTSCHLAND IN BADEN-BADEN.

These two companies provide three-quarters of ARTE's programming in equal proportion, the remainder being provided by ARTE GEIE and the channel's European partners. The members are responsible for submitting programme proposals, which have to be approved by the Programme Committee and are subsequently broadcast from Strasbourg. They jointly finance and control headquarters operations in Strasbourg. while also representing the interests of French and German partners before ARTE GEIE's decision making bodies.

ARTE* was founded on 30 April, 1991 as a European Economic Interest Grouping (GEIE). It is composed of two equal members: ARTE Deutschland TV GmbH and ARTE France. Article 2 of the contract establishing ARTE GEIE defines its role: "The purpose of this grouping is to conceive and produce television programmes which, in a broad sense, are cultural and international in character and conducive to promoting understanding and cooperation between Europe's nations and to broadcast these programmes or to authorise their broadcast."

The purpose of a European Economic Interest Grouping (EEIG/GEIE) is to promote cross-border cooperation and facilitate or develop the economic activity of its members. Governed by European and not national law, its flexible legal structure enables its members to group part of their activities while retaining their legal and economic independence.

The Management Board directs the channel's operations and reports regularly to the General Assembly. It has four members: the President, the Vice President, the Programme Director, and the Administrative Director. Each is appointed for a four year term of office. Representatives of ARTE France and ARTE Deutschland may be invited to attend extended meetings of the Management Board.



BUDGET

In both France and Germany, 95% of funding for the channel comes from the direct tax on home television sets. The channel is not allowed to show advertising, but may seek additional revenue from other sources, in particular, corporate patronage.

ARTE GEIE is a financially independent, self-governing entity. In addition to management controls exercised by two controllers from ARTE France and ARTE Deutschland appointed by the General Assembly — currently Olivier Guillemot and Peter Latzel — and the financial controls provided by the auditors, an external control function has been created to check on the implementation of resolutions adopted by the General Assembly, compliance with current legislative requirements, and the effective use of funds.



ARTE IN THE WORLD

In order to promote programme distribution and international creation, ARTE France is active on several international fronts including: cooperation with countries bordering Europe; distribution in Africa; synergies with TV5Monde and Canal France International; the ARTE Awards for feature film projects

in Europe, the Middle East and Latin America; and participation in various documentary training workshops worldwide. These are the main strands of a grassroots "foreign policy" that has progressively expanded over the last 20 years.





ARTE LIVE ON ALL SORTS OF SCREENS

OPTIMUM PICTURE AND SOUND QUALITY

In France and in Germany, ARTE broadcasts its programmes 24/7 in HD quality via satellite (Astra and Hotbird), cable, ADSL and, in France, digital terrestrial television (DTT). ARTE broadcasts all its programmes in SD and HD quality, including 80% original HD productions, as well as with multi-channel audio. ARTE also applies the European Broadcasting Union Recommendation R128 regulating loudness normalisation and permitted maximum level of audio signals during broadcast.

LIVE STREAM ON WEB AND MOBILE DEVICES

Viewers can watch ARTE on their televisions but also via live streaming 24h/7 on the ARTE website as well as on smartphones and tablets using the ARTE application available on iOS, Android, Windows Phone and Windows 8. Internet users enjoy optimum picture quality, with 1 Mbit/s and 1.5 Mbit/s in SD quality or 2.2 Mbit/s in HD quality.

CHOICE OF LANGUAGE VERSIONS

A specific feature of the channel is that ARTE produces and broadcasts all its programmes in French and German. Everyday, ARTE meets the challenge of bilingualism, producing subtitles, dubbing and voice-overs (or voice-offs), simultaneous translation of studio broadcasts, or language adaptations for major live events, such as operas, plays or festivals. The programmes broadcast by ARTE every year also include some 180 different languages and dialects translated into French and German.

With ARTE's new four-channel digital broadcasting facilities, viewers have a choice of language options — French, German, original version with subtitles and audio description. The ARTE+7 catch-up service also offers such a choice, also on mobile devices.

ARTE FOR THE HARD OF HEARING AND VISUALLY IMPAIRED

ARTE broadcasts at least two programmes per week with audio description for blind and visually impaired people. These are available in France and Germany via DTTV, satellite, DSL and cable networks. Brief commentaries describe image content and how the action is unfolding, a technique adopted by the channel as early as 1996. In addition, 100% of programmes produced by ARTE France are transmitted with subtitles for the deaf and hard of hearing.

ARTE, TELEVISION AT YOUR CONVENIENCE

ARTE+7 — THE CATCH-UP SERVICE

With the ARTE+7 catch-up service, viewers can see programmes free of charge within seven days after broadcast on the channel. This service, which has become very popular with web viewers, is also available in France from ADSL servers, smartphones, tablets, internet connected TV sets as well as community video platforms like YouTube and Dailymotion.

BROADCASTING

BROADCASTING IN FRANCE AND GERMANY

As a public service channel, ARTE can now be watched 24/7 by the entire population on both sides of the Rhine.

In FRANCE, ARTE is broadcast on all networks. All of the 27 million households can receive ARTE using the digital terrestrial network (DTTV / TNT). ARTE is also relayed by all the ADSL and cable operators as well as satellite providers. In GERMANY, most of the 35 million households receive ARTE via cable or satellite while a smaller group have chosen DTTV or ADSL.

BROADCASTING IN EUROPE AND BEYOND

ARTE is relayed by numerous satellite providers and cable networks in Europe and beyond. Almost all the online videos on the *ARTE Future*, *ARTE Concert* and *ARTE Creative* web platforms can be watched throughout the world.

In Europe, ARTE is received by the majority of households, where the channel has entered into agreements with the national public channels. Thus, 90% to 95% of households in Belgium, Luxembourg and Switzerland receive ARTE via cable, as well as 65% of households in the Netherlands. In Austria, almost 75% of households receive ARTE via cable or satellite. ARTE is broadcast via satellite all over Europe. Outside France and Germany, more than 13.5 million households can watch ARTE via cable. Additionally, French and German speaking countries have access to a selection of programmes on the ARTE+7 catch-up service.

A large number of viewers around the Mediterranean rim also follow ARTE programmes via satellite. In Africa, ARTE is broadcast via satellite, cable, MMDS and ADSL in more than twenty Francophone and Anglophone countries, via the digital service CanalSat Horizons.
