FOREWORD

Dear Opera lovers,

Opera is sometimes seen as a nostalgic escape to some distant past. Yet an opera both reflects the epoch in which it was created and the age of each new interpretation. It is an art form that for centuries has transcended all borders and language barriers and that through music has brought both people and ideas together.

In these troubled times of ours, it is very gratifying to be able to announce that ARTE Opera, the digital opera season on ARTE Concert, has become ever more European with the Polish National Opera in Warsaw (Teatr Wielki — Opera Narodowa w Warszawie) joining the network of now 22 opera houses and festivals in 13 different countries.

The autumn highlight of the 2022–2023 ARTE Opera season will be Wagner's magnum opus, The Ring of the Nibelung, a tale of power and intrigue staged by Dmitri Tcherniakov. We will encounter the great Russian director again later in the season, when he is to stage Munich's new production of Prokofiev's War and Peace – a work that could scarcely be more topical.

Another focus of the forthcoming season is Shakespeare. In addition to three operatic adaptations of plays that we all know and love, namely Thomas's Hamlet, Gounod's Roméo et Juliette and Halévy's rediscovered La tempesta, the programme also features the Donizetti project Bastarda, and with it a modern take on the life of Shakespeare's sovereign lady, Queen

Focus on...

Director in the spotlight: **Dmitri Tcherniakov**

His productions have been hailed as powerfully graphic, as distillations of the essentials with outstanding stage directions. In Berlin, Dmitri Tcherniakov faces the Herculean task of staging a new Ring cycle. The prize-winning Russian conductor's production of Wagner's epic tale of Nordic gods, their human inheritors and their eventual demise is to be conducted by Christian Thielemann. In Munich, meanwhile, Tcherniakov has taken on a no less momentous work: Sergei Prokofiev's *War and Peace*, an adaptation of Leo Tolstoy's world-famous novel that the Bayerische Staatsoper is staging for the first time in collaboration with its General Music Conductor Vladimir Jurowski.

Shakespeare and Elizabeth I

William Shakespeare's dramas have inspired countless composers from Purcell to Verdi to Benjamin Britten. ARTE Opera 2022–2023 is to feature three Shakespeare adaptations: Ambroise Thomas's Hamlet, Charles Gounod's Roméo et Juliette and Fromental Halévy's rediscovered La tempesta. Another highlight of this category is Donizetti's "Tudor tetralogy," which Olivier Fredj and Francesco Lanzillotta have reinterpreted as a staged biography of the "Virgin Queen" Elizabeth I.



In the limelight: soprano Julie Fuchs

Julie Fuchs is one of the most promising opera singers of her generation. The versatile performer's repertoire ranges from baroque to bel canto operas, from Mozart to contemporary works. In the ARTE Opera season, Fuchs features in two role debuts: as Cleopatra in Handel's *Giulio Cesare* at the Dutch National Opera and alongside Benjamin Bernheim as Juliette in Charles Gounod's *Roméo et Juliette*. In July, Julie Fuchs will also sing the title role in Monteverdi's *L'incoronazione di Poppea* at the Gran Teatre del Liceu in Barcelona.

Lakmé has been performed more than 1,600 times since it premiered in 1883 – and that is just at the Opéra Comique, Paris! Inspired by the texts of Pierre Loti, Delibes tells a surprisingly contemporary tale set in colonial India. A British officer falls in love with the daughter of a Brahmin. Their romance sparks an uprising among the Hindus that will ultimately cost the title heroine her life. Conductor Raphaël Pichon and director Laurent Pelly have dared to take a new look at the work whose "Flower duet" and "Bell aria" won it international acclaim. Sabine Devieilhe, who in the part of Lakmé thrilled both critics and audiences at the Opéra Comique back in 2014, has again been cast in the lead role, this time alongside Frédéric Antoun as Gérald and Stéphane Degout as Nilakantha.

Any suitor wishing to marry Turandot first has to solve three riddles. It is a highstakes guessing game, since those who fail are condemned to death. In his last opera Giacomo Puccini gifted the world one of the greatest operatic hits of all time: "Nessun Dorma". Yet the composer would not live to see its triumph. He died on 29 November 1924, before he could finish the work. That task fell to the Italian composer Franco Alfano, who following Puccini's sketches saw it through to completion.

Philipp Stölzl has been able to attract a truly star-studded cast for his new staging of *Turandot* at the Staatsoper Berlin. Elena Pankratova, Aida Garifullina and Yusif Eyvazov will be joined by Siegfried Jerusalem and René Pape, and at the rostrum will be grand maestro Zubin Mehta.

Das Rheingold

Alberich, a Nibelung dwarf, steals the gold hidden in the Rhine to make a ring that will grant "power beyond measure". Meanwhile, the father of the gods Wotan is under pressure to pay the giants Fasolt and Fafner for building his magnificent castle. By enlisting the help of the cunning fire god Loge he is able to snatch the gold from Alberich, who responds by cursing the ring and all its future owners.

Wagner ushers in the mythological world whose dramatic rise and fall are about to be played out before us from a low E-flat on the double basses. It is a world populated by gods, giants, dwarves and dragons, all of them occupying a different level of a hierarchical world order that is rife with rivalries and conflict.

To consolidate his power, Wotan needs progeny. The separated twins Siegmund and Sieglinde seem ideally suited to the role, and one day fate does indeed bring them together. But Fricka, Wotan's consort, takes against the twins, and even Wotan himself is torn. When his favourite daughter, the Valkyrie Brunnhilde, rebels against him, he puts her to sleep and surrounds her with a ring of fire that only one who is utterly fearless will be able to overcome. This second part of the tetralogy features some of its best music, including such impressive instrumental pieces as the "Ride of the Valkyries" and the "Magic Fire music".

He knows nothing of his parentage and possesses only fragments of a sword left to him by his father. Out of these fragments, however, Siegfried forges a sword with which to slay the dragon Fafner, who now guards the ring. Siegfried seizes the ring for himself and, being fearless, is able to rouse Brunnhilde from her slumbers.

The third part of the tetralogy recalls both the Grimm Brothers' *Story of the Youth who Went Forth to Learn what Fear Was* and episodes from the medieval *Nibelungenlied*. The gods appear one last time, including the once so powerful Wotan, who has since metamorphosed into a wanderer. He will henceforth play almost no active role in the story, because the future now belongs to Siegfried and Brunnhilde, or so it seems...

The Norns' Rope of Destiny snaps and the world is cast adrift. With the gods paralysed by the prospect of their imminent demise, the mortals take to fighting among themselves for the upper hand. Brunnhilde and Siegfried are sucked into their power games, most of which are initiated by Alberich's son Hagen. The slaying of Siegfried, however, heralds impending disaster, even if that disaster holds within it the hope of something new.

Götterdämmerung is at once the climax and the keystone of the whole monumental Ring cycle, which Wagner conceived in the aftermath of the 1848-49 revolution, even if he finished it only in 1874 – and then only after a long struggle and an interruption of several years.

Prospero the magician and his daughter Miranda live in exile on an enchanted island. When a ship from the King of Naples comes into view, Prospero conjures a terrible storm to make it wash up on his island. Among the shipwrecked is his brother Antonio, who once drove him out of Milan...

Shakespeare's romance The Tempest has inspired composers of all periods from Henry Purcell to Mozart and Thomas Adès. Among those to engage with the play was also Fromental Halévy, whose fame these days rests mainly on his opera La Juive and his libretto for Bizet's Carmen. The libretto for *La tempesta* is the work of Eugène Scribe, who won worldwide acclaim as a librettist for Verdi, Rossini, Donizetti, Meyerbeer and Offenbach.

While the opera's London premiere of 1850 was a success, La tempesta was soon forgotten. The team of the Wexford Festival, however, delved deep into the archives and there found enough to be able to reconstruct Halévy's work. After 170 years of obscurity, therefore, La tempesta is finally being brought back to life in a staging by Roberto Catalano conducted by Francesco Cilluffo.

Following his defeat in the Roman Civil War, Pompey flees to Egypt to escape Caesar's influence. Pharaoh Ptolemy, however, has him assassinated to be able to present his head to the Roman Consul. Cleopatra, the Pharaoh's sister, intends to seduce Caesar to win his support for her own pretensions to the Egyptian throne.

Giulio Cesare is bursting with virtuoso arias and subtly emotional passages in which Handel's brilliance as a composer is on full display. At the rostrum in Amsterdam will be Emmanuelle Haïm, a specialist in the Baroque repertoire, conducting her orchestra Le Concert d'Astrée. And not only is Handel's score in excellent hands, but the celebrated French soprano Julie Fuchs is to sing the part of Cleopatra alongside countertenor Christophe Dumaux in the title role.

An opera that is off the scale in every respect, Prokofiev's adaptation of Tolstoy's epic novel is a powerful dramatization of the love story between Natasha Rostova and Andrei Bolkonsky and the Russian army's struggle to repel Napoleon's Grande Armée. The composer's most important work for the stage interweaves social drama and historical narrative in a vast, thirteen-scene panorama.

This production of *War and Peace* will be Munich's first ever staging of the work. Russian director Dmitri Tcherniakov transplants the plot into the present so that many of the scenes play out in seemingly everyday, even intimate, settings and situations. Never once does he let his audience flee to a more distanced perspective; on the contrary, we cannot help but be moved by all these flawed figures and their now successful, now futile pursuit of happiness.

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and his librettist Lorenzo Da Ponte took a huge risk the very first time they collaborated in that they began work on Le nozze di Figaro without any commission or promise of a production or even payment. Emperor Joseph II, moreover, had recently banned the comedy by Beaumarchais on which the opera is based on grounds of the "revolting material" that it contains. With considerable diplomatic skill, however, Da Ponte was able to allay the emperor's concerns and was so persuasive that the emperor later insisted that *Le nozze di Figaro* be premiered in his very own Hofburgtheater.

These days, it is impossible to imagine the Vienna State Opera without Mozart's musical rom-com. This new staging of *Figaro* for the Haus am Ring is the work of Barrie Kosky, one of the most innovative opera directors of our times. General Music Director Philippe Jordan will be conducting a young ensemble with Andrè Schuen, Hanna-Elisabeth Müller, Ying Fang and Peter Kellner in the main roles.

"To be or not to be" – Shakespeare and his plays still stir the minds of poets, philosophers and musicians even today. The nineteenth-century Romantics were especially taken with the *Tragedy of Hamlet*, *Prince of Denmark*. What fascinated them was not just the prince's existential musings but also Ophelia's unrequited love and the vengeful ghost of Hamlet's father. Ambroise Thomas adapted Shakespeare's work to make it fit the musical and dramatic forms of French Grand Opera.

The darker reaches of the human psyche are a key element in all of Krzysztof Warlikowski's stagings and in Hamlet, too, he relishes the madness underlying both Shakespeare's drama and Thomas's adaptation of it. The great French baritone Ludovic Tézier is to sing the title role with Lisette Oropesa as Ophelia.

Just one last kiss for her lifeless lover and then Juliet will follow him into death. Whereas in Shakespeare's version of the story, the world's most famous star-crossed lovers are denied the joy of seeing each other alive one last time, Charles Gounod is much kinder to them. In his operatic adaptation of Shakespeare's play, Romeo and Juliet bid each other farewell in a duet, in which they beseech God to forgive them for seeking redemption in death. Roméo et Juliette is Gounod's most important opera after Faust.

This new staging in Zurich has Julie Fuchs and Benjamin Bernheim playing the title roles. Both began their career at Opernhaus Zürich and have since then dedicated themselves to the French repertoire. The staging is the work of American director Ted Huffman, who is returning to Zurich specially for the occasion.

The bastard child of a reigning king, a regent enmeshed in courtly intrigue, a deified Virgin Queen – Elizabeth I of England fascinated Gaetano Donizetti as she did almost no other composer. Four of his operas are set in the Elizabethan period and turn on the eponymous monarch: *Elisabetta al castello di Kenilworth* (1829), *Anna Bolena* (1830), *Maria Stuarda* (1834) and *Roberto Devereux* (1837). Director Olivier Fredj and conductor Francesco Lanzillotta have combined these four episodic operas to form *Bastarda*, a single ambitious fresco recounting the life of Elizabeth I. The work explores the complex figure of this powerful queen who constantly had to choose between raison d'etat and her most personal feelings from both a historical and a psychological perspective.

Montiverdi's *Poppea* may be 380 years old, but it has a surprisingly modern feel to it. The music is certainly persuasive at conveying Nero's hysterical tyranny and Poppea's sensual allures.

Calixto Bieito's 2018 production premiered in Zurich, where it won the acclaim of both audiences and critics alike. The obsessive, incredibly vain protagonists inhabit a glamorous world of smug self-satisfaction. Julie Fuchs as Poppea will let neither setbacks nor outright defeats deter her from rising from ambitious courtesan to empress. David Hansen's Nero, meanwhile, is so enchanted by the beautiful Poppea that when Seneca expresses his disapproval of her, he is ordered to commit suicide. Holding sway in the pit is Jordi Savall, an unrivalled connoisseur of the repertoire.
